Today Caroline's Rainbow Foundation, the charity set up following the tragic murder of Caroline Stuttle, is today marking its 5th anniversary with the launch of a new website designed to promote safety awareness to young travellers.

The launch, hosted by the Suzy Lamplugh Trust at the National Centre for Personal Safety, has been hailed as a great success. Young people, seeking a gap year, will be able to use the website to gather information on countries they intend to visit. The knowledge gained enables these travellers to respect local custom and culture, and thus avoid situations that can put their safety at risk.
